JUNE SINGLE FAMILY MEDIAN PRICES BREAK RECORD AGAIN

PORTSMOUTH - For the third time in less than a year, single-family sales in the 13 Sample Seacoast Towns set a new median price record, according to statistics just released by the Seacoast Board of REALTORS.

The 13 Sample Seacoast Towns are Exeter, Greenland, Hampton, Hampton Falls, New Castle, Newfields, Newington, North Hampton, Newmarket, Portsmouth, Rye, Seabrook, and Stratham.

The new monthly median record of \$662,500 completely eclipsed the old mark of \$625,000 set last month. Meanwhile inventory levels reached the highest level since October, although the 114 available units were the

lowest-ever for the month of June. By comparison, there were 205 available units last june. Still, sales remained virtually flat for the month, declining 18.9% from a year ago. Nevertheless, there were a June-record 16 sales of \$1m dollars or more, including two closings more than \$4.3 million dollars in Portsmouth and Hampton, respectively.

For the first six months of 2021, sales are up 3.6% and median sale prices are up 14% at \$600,000.

Condominium inventory also hit an all-time June low, but month to month sales remained virtually flat although 60% higher than last year. The monthly median for June was \$355,000,

well-off April's record \$459,100. For the first six months of 2021, despite inventory shortages, condominium sales are up an impressive 41.2% and the cumulative median stands at \$380,000, up 9.5% from last year.

"We are entering what appears to be another strong summer market," said Ted Mantos, President of the Seacoast Board of REALTORS. "There seems to be sustained demand for very limited inventory which continues to put upward pressure on prices."

HOW TO PLANT YOUR OWN FLOWER GARDEN



Starting a flower garden in that empty space in your yard is a great way to increase the curb appeal of your home and an opportunity to apply some of your personality to your outdoor area.

First, find an area you could use for your flower garden and try to identify if the space gets direct sun, partial sun, or shade.

The amount of sunlight that your garden gets determines what kinds of flowers you can grow.

For example, chrysanthemums and sunflowers need about 6-8 hours of sun per day, so they would not last very long in a shady nook, while fuchsias or begonias would thrive.

The next step is to decide whether you want to plant seedlings or buy your flowers from a nursery. This really depends on how much time you have to spend and it won't affect how nice your garden is. Once you have selected flowers that will grow well in your garden space, take some time to make a diagram for where they will all be placed.

One of the last steps before planting is to mix manure or compost in your soil a week before planting. Now it's time for the best part, planting your flowers! You will need a shovel, rake, and trowel for this step. The goal here is to loosen the soil and create snug holes for your flowers. Depending on how many flowers you have, this process should only take a day or two.

Finally, enjoy your flower garden and see if any butterflies come to enjoy your creation too!

EASY AND VERSATILE BURRATA RECIPE

I've recently discovered the magical cheese that is burrata. The nice thing about working with burrata is that it's laid back and easy. Because this fancy cheese is so good in itself,, you barely need to dress it up. Here's all you need to do for this burrata recipe:

- Burrata: Place one ball on a plate. If you'd like, you can also tear off pieces of a second ball to add visual appeal (see the photo).
- Fruit or tomatoes: Surround it with ripe summer fruit like peaches, tomatoes, melon (watermelon, cantaloupe or honeydew), strawberries, or blackberries.
- Herbs: Add fresh summer herbs! Basil is our favorite (reminiscent of a <u>Caprese salad</u>), but oregano and thyme are also lovely.
- Olive oil: Drizzle with a high quality extra virgin olive oil, which ties it all together.
